Co-creation of Water Knowledge

Objectives (provisional)

Short-term

 A multidisciplinary network of scientists active in co-creation approaches to water management and hydrology, with shared definitions and principles, and working to increase awareness in the hydrological community.

Long-term

 Database of good practices of collaboration and co-creation of knowledge, both from existing research and new experiences within the WG.

Ultimate

 Local and indigenous knowledge is considered alongside scientific and official knowledge for water resource management problems, with wellestablished approaches and the involvement of different epistemic communities.
